

## **How Are Republicans Preparing for the Midterms?**

With the US midterms weeks away, Trump is bribing voters with \$5,000, branding Democrats as communists, and banning critical media from the White House.

Details. The 2026 Republican National Convention in Dallas set out the Republican electoral strategy ahead of the midterms, with [Trump himself](#) asking the RNC crowd to pledge their allegiance to him.

► Trump attempted to bribe the electorate with the "[Trump dividend](#)", promising to pay \$5,000 from tariff revenue to every American adult, on condition that Republicans hold a majority in both houses of Congress. However, the exorbitant [cost](#) and the [failure](#) to deliver on his past promise of a "tariff dividend" make this unlikely to materialise.

► Republicans are ramping up [anti-communist](#) fearmongering around certain Democratic candidates, [claiming](#) there is a "Bolshevik Revolution in the Democratic Party" and [promising](#) to be crusaders who ensure "[America will never be a communist country](#)". Republicans have also seized on figures like [Hasan Piker](#), who falsely present themselves as communist, to portray growing left-wing sentiment among Democratic voters as "communist" influence.

► The White House suddenly banned major news outlets from its press briefings, claiming they had failed to publicise his "[achievements](#)". In response, several outlets announced they would [stop broadcasting](#) the presidential press pool. Trump already relies heavily on his Truth Social platform for announcements, and has now launched his own "[Trump TV](#)".

► Trump is dismissing the declining state of the economy, [claiming](#) it has never been better. He has used press releases to make [claims](#) such as "the poverty rate has reached its lowest level in American history". At the same time, the administration refuses to admit [evident failures](#) in resolving the war with Iran. Hoping to deflect the conflict's impact on the midterms, Trump [claimed](#) "the war is going to end immediately after the election".

► Trump has also attempted to reform electoral law in his favour, particularly by limiting voter participation. His latest attack on mail-in voting was [blocked](#) by the Supreme Court, while his party's [gerrymandering](#) strategy succeeded in several states.

Context. The Republican Party is [forecast](#) to suffer a severe loss that would cost them their Congressional majority. Driven by the economic crisis, [increasingly unpopular](#) immigration policy, and worsening living conditions, Trump's approval has reached the [lowest ever rating](#) for a sitting president at 30%, dragging his party down with him. A negative outcome in this election would give strong impetus to the growing movement within the party to move away from MAGA.

► The oil [price shock](#) from the Iran war has deepened the economic crisis American workers were already facing: heightened [food prices](#) and steadily rising [rent](#) have kept [poverty](#) measures above pre-Covid levels. While Trump has [increased wealth](#) for capitalists through deregulation and [expanded](#) domestic production, workers have seen no relief.

► Unable to address these fundamental problems, Democratic and Republican leadership compete to outdo each other in populism and fearmongering. Anti-communist hysteria is a prominent feature for both, Bernie Sanders and others have repeatedly called Trump's right-wing administration "[Stalinist](#)".
