

Protests in Ukraine And Protests in Kazakhstan: What's The Difference?

Ukraine, 2014

1. Started in the capital city, almost no involvement from the regions.
2. Unconditionally supported by the Western capitalists.
3. Supported mainly by liberals, radicals and petty bourgeoisie.
4. Protests well-organized, with good amount of money and equipment.
5. Clear political demands, expressing the interests of the Western bourgeoisie.
6. Organized by the Western and Ukrainian oligarchs against the Russian ones.

Kazakhstan, 2022

1. Started in industrial regions, reaching the capital in few days.
2. Uncertain "pacifist" reaction of the West.
3. Mostly workers were involved.
4. Disorganized spontaneous protest without any clear set of demands.
5. Mainly economic demands, but vague political ones.
6. Spontaneous protest of the workers for their rights, failed due to the absence of the Communist party.
