

Stalin on Collectivism

“ **There is no, nor should there be,**

irreconcilable contrast between the **individual** and the **collective**, between the interests of the individual person and the interests of the collective. There should be no such contrast, because collectivism, socialism, does not deny, but **combines** individual interests with the interests of the collective.

Socialism cannot abstract itself from individual interests. Socialist society alone can most fully satisfy these personal interests. More than that; socialist society alone can **firmly safeguard** the interests of the individual. In this sense there is no irreconcilable contrast between "individualism" and socialism.
